1. CALL TO ORDER

Ms. Lanni-Hewitt called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

3. EDUCATIONAL PRESENTATIONS AND UPDATES

3.1 Ex-Officio Board Member

Emily Edwards shared that the girls varsity basketball team defeated Harbor Fields to win the Suffolk County Girls Basketball Championship this past Friday at Stony Brook University. This is the team's third consecutive county championship. The girls will now advance to the Long Island Championship where they will face Garden City this Wednesday at 5:30 at Stony Brook University. Spring sports officially began this afternoon. The student government hosted a volleyball tournament this past Wednesday with 11 teams. The event raised over \$300 which will be used to purchase food that will be donated to East End Hospice. West Hampton Beach High School Seascape's literary magazine received a national recognition, earning a superior distinction from the National Council of Teachers of English for its June 2025 issue. Brady Schultz was recently recognized as the class of 2026 valedictorian, and Maiya Boughal was recently recognized as the class of 2026 salutatorian. Brett Geller, Cameron Hipp, Bella Ruggiero, and William Sultan recently earned a spot in the prestigious New York State Band Directors Association honor contest.

3.2 Elementary Presentation

Fourth grade elementary students presented to the board about Responsibility. The presentation focused on what responsibility means to them. They described some responsibilities they have in school such as taking care of their classroom pets. They shared a play that they presented to the school about being responsible by working together to accomplish a goal. Then, the students shared a video they filmed from the HS Hurricane Watch Studios. They wanted to find out how people of different ages thought about responsibility, so they asked students and teachers around the elementary school and high school. The fourth-grade students did a wonderful job with the presentation.

3.3 2026-27 Budget Presentation

Dr. Probst spoke about the upcoming budget vote and shared that there is more work to be done in the budget development process. She shared that although it is early in the process, the district knows that they currently have an allowable budget increase of 1.82% for next year. The district is in year fifteen of the property tax cap and each year, the district feels the constraints of that cap, which make it difficult when costs are going up and student is going down. Some of the increases include health insurance costs over 11%, supplies and materials 4-5%, utilities 5-25%, general insurance just over 13% and transportation costs of possibly as much as 15-20%. More detailed presentations will be given as the building and department budget requests are received as we continue through the spring.

**RESOLUTION OF BOARD OF EDUCATION
OF PARTICIPATING SCHOOL DISTRICT**

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Eastport-South Manor Central School District (“District”) is authorized pursuant to General Municipal Law §119-o to enter into Intermunicipal Agreements for the cooperative performance of services; and

WHEREAS, Article 5-G of the New York State General Municipal Law authorizes municipal corporations to enter into cooperative agreements for the performance or exercise of services, functions, powers, or activities on a cooperative or contract basis among themselves or one for the other; and

WHEREAS, Section 119-n of the General Municipal Law defines the term “municipal corporation” for the purposes of Article 5-G as a county outside the city of New York, a city, a town, a village, a board of cooperative educational services, a fire district or a school district; and

WHEREAS, the District is a “municipal corporation” as defined above; and

WHEREAS, the District, the Westhampton Beach Union Free School District and the Center Moriches Union Free School District (collectively, the “Participating School Districts”) wish to jointly solicit proposals for pupil transportation services to commence in the 2026-2027 school year in accordance with General Municipal Law §119-o and the terms and conditions of the Intermunicipal Agreement attached hereto; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board hereby authorizes the District to participate in the cooperative solicitation of proposals for pupil transportation services; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED , that the Board hereby approves the Intermunicipal Agreement attached hereto and authorizes the Superintendent of Schools or Board President to execute the Agreement on behalf of the Board.

7.6 Adoption of the Eastern Suffolk BOCES Joint Municipal Cooperative Bidding Program for the 2026-27 School Year

WHEREAS, various educational and municipal corporations located within the State of New York desire to bid jointly for generally needed services and standardized supply and equipment items; and

WHEREAS, the Westhampton Beach UFSD, an educational/municipal corporation (hereinafter the "Participant") is desirous of selectively participating with other educational and/or municipal corporations in the State of New York in joint bidding in the areas mentioned above pursuant to General Municipal Law § 119-o and Education Law Section 1950; and

WHEREAS, the Participant is a municipality within the meaning of General Municipal Law § 119-n and is eligible to participate in the Board of Cooperative Educational Services, First Supervisory District of Suffolk County (hereinafter Eastern Suffolk BOCES) Joint Municipal Cooperative Bidding Program (hereinafter the "Program") in the areas mentioned above; and

WHEREAS, the Participant acknowledges receipt of the Program description inclusive of Eastern Suffolk BOCES' standard bid packet and the general conditions relating to said Program; and

WHEREAS, with respect to all activities conducted by the Program, the Participant wishes to delegate to Eastern Suffolk BOCES the responsibility for drafting of bid specifications, advertising for bids, accepting and opening bids, evaluating bids, awarding via Eastern Suffolk BOCES Board approval, and reporting the results to the Participant; and

WHEREAS, the Participant acknowledges that "additional insured" status shall be secured by signing a risk transfer/Indemnification Agreement when engaging services through the Cooperative Bidding Program with each awarded vendor when Services are requested. Said agreement must be signed by both parties and will remain in effect for the current term of the Bid. In the event the Bid is extended, and a Participant requires Service, a new risk transfer/Indemnification Agreement must be executed; and

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Participant hereby appoints Eastern Suffolk BOCES to represent it and to act as the lead agent in all matters related to the Program as described above; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Participant hereby authorizes Eastern Suffolk BOCES to place all legal advertisements for any required cooperative bidding in Newsday, which is designated as the official newspaper for the Program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a Participant Meeting shall be held annually consisting of a representative from each Program Participant. Notice of the meeting shall be given to each representative at least five (5) days prior to such meeting; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an Advisory Committee will be formed consisting of five to ten representatives of Program Participants for a term of three (3) years as authorized by General Municipal Law §119-o.2.j; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Agreement with the Participant shall be for a term of one (1) year as authorized by General Municipal Law §119-o.2.j; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Participant agrees to pay Eastern Suffolk BOCES an annual fee as determined annually by Eastern Suffolk BOCES to act as the lead agent for the Program.
